The starting time for this worship service (along with the other outdoor worship services on July 3, August 7, and September 4) is 10:00 a.m. Following worship on June 19 is our Father's Day Picnic. The safety of our worshipers is our primary concern.

Although masks are not required, the use of masks during Services is strongly recommended.

In addition to "in-person" worship, Services are viewable live each Sunday morning on St. Peter's Facebook page and on St. Peter's Lutheran Church, Hilltown, PA YouTube page after the Service.

Our worship services on June 5, 12, and 26 will start at 9:00 a.m. However, on the recommendation of the Worship and Music Committee and with the approval of the Congregation Council, our worship services on the Sundays in July, August, and September (that is, July 3 through September 25) will start at 10:00 a.m. This is designed as an experiment to see if this time change will bring more people to worship. The Congregation Council and the Worship and Music Committee will evaluate the response and make a decision about worship starting times beyond September. Please note this change.

I am deeply awed by the generosity of the people of St. Peter's for contributions to Ukrainian relief efforts. The congregation gave a total of \$6,700 (\$5,000 from the Memorial Fund and \$1,700 from additional contributions). I thank all who contributed so generously.

On a personal note, I am pleased to mention that I began service initially as your bridge pastor on June 18 four years ago. Where has the time gone? I thank you for the opportunity to serve as your pastor, both as a bridge and under call. You have blessed my life in so many wonderful ways. I look forward to the continuation of our journey together. God bless you all!

In the sure and certain knowledge of the Resurrection to Eternal Life, St. Peter's notes the passing of William (Bill) Detweiler on May 10. A graveside Service was held in St. Peter's Union Cemetery on May 17, led by Pastor Miller.

Bill is survived by his wife of 72 years, Julia. They recently relocated to Weatherly, PA.

Bill was a long-time, active member of St. Peter's. He and Julia delivered flowers to the homebound, helped in the kitchen, and opened up the church building on Sundays until the past couple of years. He sewed squares for the quilting group and helped around the building whenever and in whatever capacity needed.

A veteran of World War II (he was a gunner instructor in the Army Air Force), Bill returned to Bucks County after the war years and worked at the Royal Pants Factory in Perkasie for more than 30 years.

He enjoyed working in his lawn or garden during spring, summer, and fall. The Parish Administrator misses looking across the church parking lot and seeing him working around the house.
